All Saints Communion Sunday! The Somerset County Board of Chosen Freeholders has recognized Mercy House with "Commendations and Praise" for Mercy House's participation in the Point in Time Survey, assistance with the Drop-In Center called "Project Homeless Connect" at SHIP, and for the monthly dinners held over the winter here at First Church for the street people and homeless of the Somerville area.
